




Home School Reading






Children in Year Two and Year Three

Reading in Reception and Year One




Reading practice sessions are:

- timetabled three times a week
- taught by a trained teacher/teaching assistant
- taught in small groups







Reading in **Year Two**



Reading practice sessions are:

- timetabled three times a week through reading enrichment – Autumn 1
- carried out in small groups
- by the class teacher
- a key learning focus for each group
- as children develop their fluency skills children will be heard read by the class teacher once a week again through reading enrichment




Reading in <u>Year Three</u>

- at least three times each half-term through reading enrichment
- carried out in small groups
- by the class teacher
- a key learning focus for each group




Reception - Reading for Pleasure





Every <u>Friday</u> children can choose a book from the class library to take home


This is a book for parents and carers to read to their child

Year One - Reading for Pleasure



Children can choose a book from the reading for pleasure box

Every three weeks children visit the school library to borrow a book



Year Two and Year Three - Reading for Pleasure



 Every three weeks children can choose a reading for pleasure book which matches their reading level

This is a book for children to begin to develop their love of reading

This is a book for the child and their parent to read together

Every three weeks children visit the school library to borrow a book



Reading at home

How you can support your child reading at home



- in order to encourage your child to become a lifelong reader, it is important that they learn to read for pleasure
- Help them understand words and sentences
- use a wide range of vocabulary
- develop listening and comprehension skills

The amount of books children were exposed to by <u>age 6</u> was a positive predictor of their <u>reading</u> <u>ability two years later.</u>



How you can support your child reading at home



Please remember that you shouldn't expect your child to read this book alone.

- ✓ Read it to or with them
- ✓ Discuss the pictures
- ✓ Predict what might happen next
- ✓ Use different voices for the characters
- ✓ Explore the facts in a non-fiction book
- ✓ The main thing is that you have fun!
